

## Worcester Bus Garage

CA Refurbishment Projects brings new meaning to the words bus shelter



***The roofs of two of Worcester County Council buildings, used as bus garages, had already been subject to numerous repairs over several years and were once again leaking badly, so the decision was made to have the roofs completely refurbished.***

CA Refurbishment Projects, the newest division of the well-established CA Group, were appointed to undertake the contract.

“The existing built-up felt and mastic asphalt roofs were no longer serviceable”, says Ian Cotterill, Divisional Manager of CA Refurbishment Projects, “and there was significant water ingress, so we proposed a complete metal pitched roof installation to offer a long-term solution to the problem.”

The project commenced in February 2008 and lasted for 6 weeks, during which time, the 800m<sup>2</sup> felted roof was completely stripped and re-roofed with insulated panels. The 1,000m<sup>2</sup> mastic asphalt roof was also ‘Retro-roofed’ using a proprietary spacer system, and CA Group’s own CA 32 1000 R roof profile in a Plastisol finish, insulated with non-combustible Therma-quilt.



A complete new roof drainage system was installed, with Trueline gutters, downpipes and all flashings being supplied by CA Building Products.

“By definition, the refurbishment sector requires a varied range of product solutions and approaches,” says Ian Cotterill, “but being part of a large organisation like CA Group means that we can offer our clients a single supply source for many of the components required for their project.”
